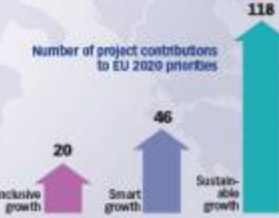

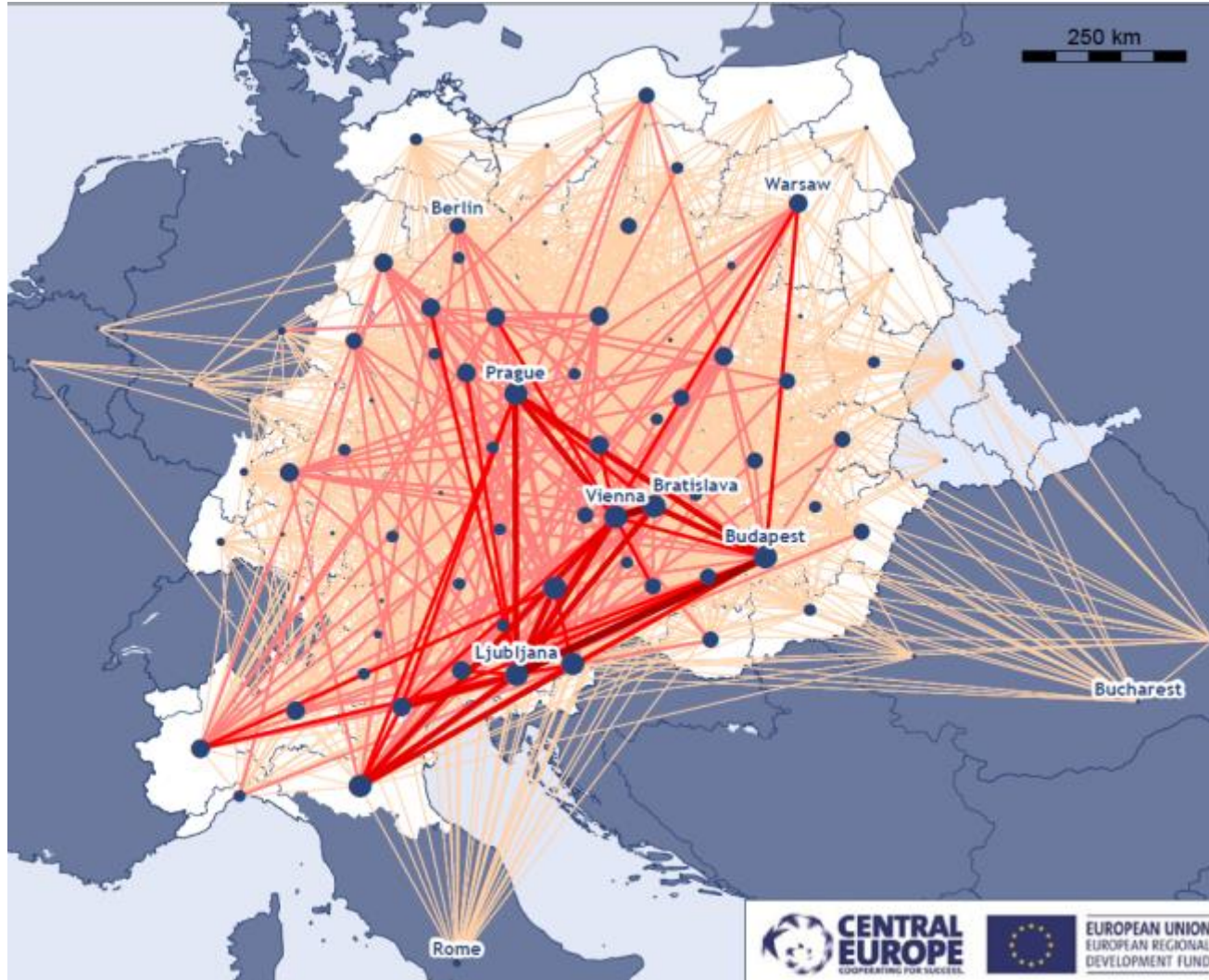
CONTRIBUTING TO EUROPE 2020

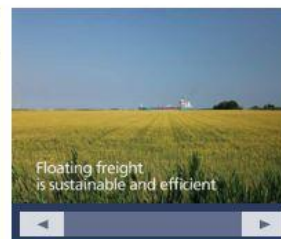
