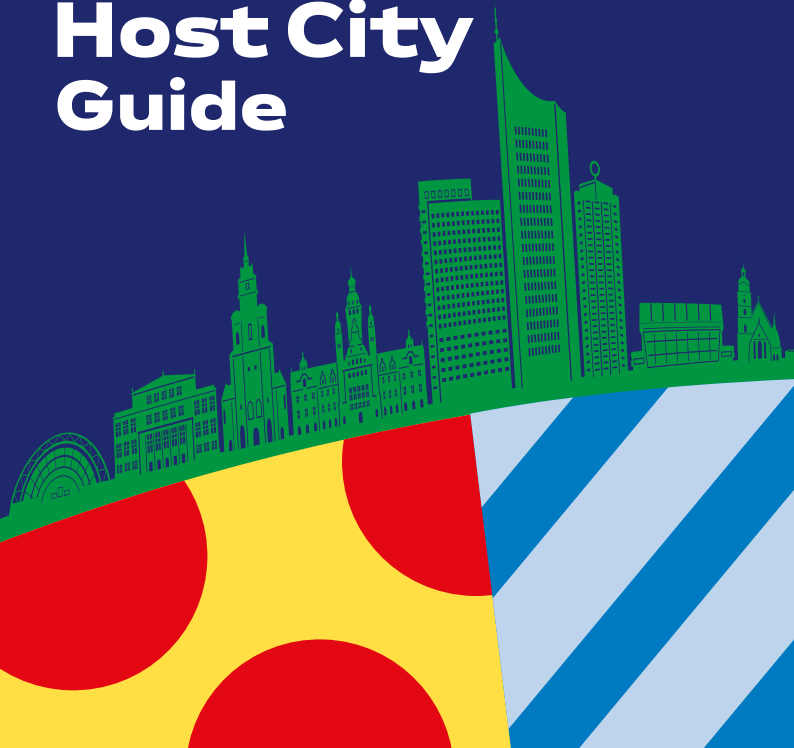

EURO 2024 FESTIVAL

As one of the venues for UEFA EURO 2024™, spending time at Leipzig Stadium can become an unforgettable experience. However, it's not the only place fans will get their money's worth, as the EURO 2024 Festival will turn the entire city centre into a gigantic football festival. The most important locations at a glance:

Fan Zone Augustusplatz

The Fan Zone is the main attraction of the EURO 2024 Festival and offers

- public viewing of all 51 matches
- stage programme, mini football pitch and hands-on activities for young and old, street entertainment with walking acts, dance, acrobatics and music
- food and drink

Admission: free

Opening hours: 1 p.m. to midnight on match days, 1 p.m. to 8 p.m. on non-match days

Fan Meeting Points (FMP)

Dedicated meeting point for fans of a national team on **Wilhelm-Leuschner-Platz** (Croatia, Netherlands, Portugal) and **Richard-Wagner-Platz** (Czechia).

Stadium of Dreams at Leipzig Zoo

From 9 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.: Family and children's programme, sports games, craft activities, educational content on fair play.

From 5.30 p.m.: Series of talks, readings, concerts, knowledge formats, salsa evenings, sports modules and barrier-free public viewing.

Opening hours: 9 a.m. to midnight

Admission: until 5.30 p.m. with zoo ticket, free from 5.30 p.m.

Info Points and Fans Welcome

Information points at the main railway station, the airport and at the Fan Zone Augustusplatz, with a contact point for fans, a "safer space" awareness shelter and tourist information.

Leipzig Stadium

Partially rebuilt in 2006 as part of the World Cup, Leipzig Stadium offers space for 42,000 fans during UEFA EURO 2024™.

Opening hours

- 1 p.m. to midnight on every match day
- 1 p.m. to 8 p.m. on non-match days

Fans Welcome and Info Point

- “safer space” awareness shelter
- contact point for fan concerns

Key information

- free entry
- only small bags allowed inside the Fan Zone
- bringing drinks is not permitted

Equipment

- two large parasols providing shade
- drinking fountains offering refreshment
- approximately 20 food stalls

Accessibility and sustainability

- wheelchair platform inside the Fan Zone
- low-barrier areas
- deposit-based reusable system for drinks with cups without labels
- waste separation

OUT AND ABOUT IN LEIPZIG

Whether you like to go dancing, have a beer or enjoy fine dining – in Leipzig you're spoilt for choice. These trendy neighbourhoods are worth exploring:



Karl-Liebnecht-Straße (KarLi):
district in the south with bars, pubs and cafés

Karl-Heine-Straße:
up-and-coming neighbourhood in the west with international bars, organic food shops and theatres

Eisenbahnstraße:
multicultural mile with international flair and delicious snack bars



Gottschedstraße:
trendy area near city centre with pubs, restaurants and discos

Barfußgässchen:
traditional pub district in city centre, known as "Drallewatsch"

You can rent **bikes** in Leipzig via nextbike by TIER. Bookable via the LeipzigMOVE app or www.nextbike.de

Tickets for public transport are






easily bought in the LeipzigMOVE app operated by LVB, at ticket machines, at stops or on trams and buses. If you have a stadium ticket for a European Championship match, you can travel free of charge for 36 hours in Leipzig.

You can also get to Leipzig quickly by train from the surrounding area. The S-Bahn (suburban) trains stop at the Main Station, Markt, Wilhelm-Leuschner-Platz and Bayerischer Bahnhof. To ensure that you can still get home at night after the match, the existing transport services are being temporarily extended.

SUSTAINABILITY

Sustainability is important to Host City Leipzig. The following measures contribute to making UEFA EURO 2024™ in Leipzig sustainable:

- greenhouse gas offsetting of all urban activities related to UEFA EURO 2024™
- predominantly vegetarian/vegan food on offer in the fan zone
- drinking fountains for free drinking water
- deposit-based reusable system for beverage cups with a neutral look
- sensitisation of guests through Green Volunteers
- use of green electricity
- use of recyclable and low-pollutant materials
- trained awareness teams on site
- water free toilets and urinals

- low-barrier areas
- wheelchair platform in the Fan Zone
- in the Fan Zone: translation of parts of the programme into sign language on 14.6. and 14.7.

LEIPZIG'S FOOTBALL HISTORY



- 1900** The German Football Association (DFB) is founded in Leipzig
- 1903** VfB Leipzig becomes 1st German champion
- 1956** Leipzig Central Stadium opens (one of the largest stadiums in Europe)
- 1964** Chemie becomes GDR champion
- 2000** Foundation stone laid for ultra-modern football arena with 43,500 seats
- 2006** Football World Cup takes place in Leipzig among others
- 2009** RB Leipzig is founded
- 2016** RB Leipzig is promoted to the 1st Bundesliga
- 2022** RB Leipzig wins the DFB Cup
- 2023** RB Leipzig wins the DFB Cup for the second time
- 2024** Leipzig is Host City of the UEFA EURO 2024™

You would like to escape the hustle and bustle of football?
How about a trip to one of these green places in Leipzig?

1

Leipzig Riverside Forest stretches 30 kilometres from the north to the south of the city. In the northern part, the 118-hectare **Rosental** invites you to stroll and linger.

As one of the largest park cemeteries in Germany, the **Südfriedhof (South Cemetery)** enchants visitors with its rare plant species and architectural treasures.

3

The **Saxons' Bridge** serves as a meeting point for young Leipzigers and is the perfect place to enjoy the idyllic atmosphere of **Clara Zetkin Park** – usually referred to here as Clara Park.

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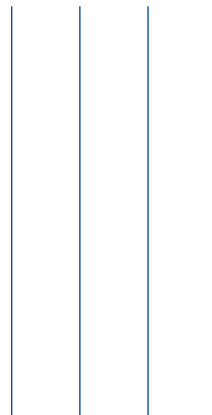
